For these articles, I have been going through our church's principle purposes as a church, which include worship, edification, and outreach. For the last sermon, we started looking at worship and the preaching part of worship. I am currently looking at different aspects of our worship and we might rearrange a few things and if we do, I'll attempt to address those here in these articles.

In this column though, I want to address what we normally think of when worship is mentioned and that is music. In many churches, worship music is a sore subject. That's because many churches devolve in what is commonly called "worship wars." I'm very thankful that I have never witnessed any of this within Bergen Presbyterian. Personally, I think the whole notion of these worship wars is absurd. Worship is principally about our worship to our wonderful, gracious Savior, and hostile attitudes concerning worship do not have a place within our fellowship.

I honestly see both sides of the so-called worship war. I see the viewpoint that worship should contain the richness of songs from the centuries past, but also have an appeal to the cultural setting. This is one of the many reasons why I value Christin so much is because she finds an amazing way of bringing the two together in a seamless manner, bringing a wonderful unity to the worship services from the past and present. As she is leading us in worship in song, I find it very difficult to think that we would ever devolve into some type of "worship war" simply because the mix of old and modern songs are very good.

However, what if, for some reason, we were not to like some of the songs very much? I find that very hard to believe, but within the pulpit, you have heard me talk about how I really don't like the song "O Worship the King," but it is one of my favorite hymns to sing (or in my case, make a joyful noise) because I love the words so much. You see, there is a very important principle that I have come to understand which is really important and that is that even if I don't like a particular tune, it should in no way take away my joy in singing the words. I had to learn that the difficult way. I have been in churches where I did not like the music very much. One of those is within the church plant where we had to sing to only recorded music. I had to learn to take joy within the words themselves, despite if I really didn't like the music very much.

That lesson has served me well throughout the years. With that understanding of worship, I find my focus is much more on the words and my worship is more centered upon Jesus and His Gospel. Sure, it helps when I enjoy the music as well, but I have learned (honestly, the hard way) in paying much more attention to the words than the music. This is also where I am thankful for Christin and all of our musicians (I have to admit though that my wife is prettier than the rest.) over the past few years as they are obviously taking joy in the words that they are singing which enables me to much more sing with a heart of devotion to my Savior. My hope and prayer is that this would be the case for all of us this year.

### **Live-Stream Worship Now on YouTube**

Almost a year ago we quickly put together some technology that allowed us to live-stream our services. We initially selected Zoom and Facebook as a two-pronged approach that allowed us to reach the most number of people. Now, based on improvements to the equipment that we are using and a (long needed) upgrade to the church's internet service, we are able to offer high-quality streaming on YouTube.

Each Sunday will have a different link (web address) and Brenda will send this out in the Life of the Church email on Wednesday each week. This link will also be posted on the church's Facebook page. However, the easiest way to access the stream week after week is to use the following link to the church's YouTube page:

The current week stream will always be at the top of the list on the home page. You can also access the recordings of any of the past services on this page. The YouTube live-stream doesn't require any sign-on or password to access. However, if you want to "like", comment, or subscribe, you will need a Google sign-on. Just to be clear, this is totally optional.

The YouTube stream includes the lyrics for the songs in the lower-right corner. So, we will discontinue the publishing of the slides for each service on the Google site that I had created.

And, for those who have been attending in person, we will no longer need the phone and related hardware in the middle of the sanctuary. MANY thanks to David Snell (and Jonathan as backup) for the many months of faithfully running this camera. David has joined me in working on all of the equipment for the YouTube streaming along with sound for the live service.



This month we introduce you to Jesse and Deborah von Bergen. Jesse is a grandson of Dick and Shirley. Jesse and Deborah met at Bible college and have been serving for five years on the staff of Martinsville Baptist Tabernacle in Indiana, but this year are focused on raising funds for full-time ministry to the Arab world through Arabic Bible Outreach Ministry. They will come to Bergen in December so we can hear from them directly.



Jesse says: Shortly after I was saved the Lord called me in a specific way to be an ambassador for Christ internationally. He gave me a burden and love for Muslim Arabs since my time in Bible college over 10 years ago. God has allowed me to visit seven different Muslim countries as well as study the Arabic language. Deborah says: Building relationships with several Arabic women in the US, and seeing the Middle East first hand, has put an unquenchable desire in my heart to minister to women who are hurting and need the hope of Jesus Christ. God has opened up many doors over the last several years for me to counsel women, and I look forward to serving Him in these ways alongside Jesse in the Middle East.




# Church Finances January 2021

The giving for January of \$15,920 was below the budget target of \$17,331 but was much higher than for the three previous Januarys when the totals were under \$13,000. Expenses were low, and only \$1,000 was needed from our Accumulated Income Fund (AIF) to pay the bills. Speaking of that, these early months of each year is when the annual gifts to the AIF are received. These gifts are some family's choices to give their annual support to the church's budget in one lump payment at the start of each year. So far in 2021 those early gifts have totaled \$32,500.
