# From the Pastor

I eventually want to return to different methods of evangelism (I think the next one is service.), but as we continue in Exodus, we will come upon God's law, and I think it's important that we consider a popular misconception about Christianity.

"You shall have no," "You shall not," and "You shall not." All of these are quotes from Exodus 20, what we popularly call the 10 commandments. Within these 10 commandments (15 verses), God gives 11 negatives.

Honestly, when one sees this, it is understandable as to why people often view Christianity as only a list of rules. This is often the perception that I get when strangers find out that I'm a preacher. There is an automatic assumption that all God really cares about, and thus, all I really care about, is correcting one's behavior.

What's missing is the context of the 10 commandments. As with all areas of the Bible, the surrounding verses are vitally important in understanding what the 10 commandments meant for the Old Testament Israelites, and what they mean for us today.

So, what's the context? Exodus 20:1-2 states, "And God spoke all these words, saying, 'I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery." The context of these wonderful commandments is that God gave them to a people He rescued, that He redeemed, from the bondage of slavery, and this was completely out of His grace and love, not based on any merit of the Israelites.

So, does this mean that the 10 commandments do not apply to us, as Christians, since God has not rescued us out of the bondage of slavery from Egypt? Of course not. Part of the reason why these 10 commandments are given are so that we understand this is God's will for humankind.

This is seen quite easily in how much each of the commandments are emphasized throughout the Bible.

Also, on this side of the cross, as New Testament Christians, do we have a reason to obey the 10 commandments the way the Israelites were supposed to? Of course. If anything, we have more reason to obey these words from God than the Israelites did. While they were rescued from the bondage of slavery, we were rescued from the bondage of slavery, and from the very depths of Hell itself.

Now, the problem with Israel is that they never did seem to appreciate what God had done for them in bringing them out of the bondage of slavery in Egypt. Moreover, we will be able to see that as they not only grumble how much better Egypt was, but how they continually disobeyed God in so many areas of their lives.

In the same way, we can often gripe and grumble about our circumstances, and show that we don't appreciate what Christ has done for us on the cross by our willful disobedience to God and His law that was given to us. That is why it is so important that not only do we clearly understand the cross of Christ, but we deeply value the sacrifice that Christ has made for us. In doing so, we will love Jesus more and more each day and take to heart His words from John 14:15, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments."

Finally, when we talk about these 10 commandments to non-Christians, it is vitally important that we share the context of not only when God first introduced them, but more importantly, the context of the Gospel, and how our hearts long to obey Him because of what Christ has done for us. In doing so, we will hopefully show that Christianity is so much more than a religion of dos and don'ts, but a deep relationship where we have a gained an eternal friendship where we long to obey our Heavenly King.






# Church Finances November 2023

"Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. And thereby put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need."

November was a good month for giving, \$16,395; not as good as October's extraordinary total of over \$20,000 but at about the average for this year in total. Expenses were low at about \$13,000. No funds at all needed to be used from the Accumulated Income Fund (as was the case in October), and we are running \$4,000 in giving ahead of last year's giving with only one month to go.

We are heading to the year's end in good shape with about \$6,000 balance in the operating fund checking account and a five-Sunday month to look forward to.
