Adam Chlebek is a student at the Eastman School of Music, where he is pursuing a Master of Music in Organ Performance in the studio of Nathan Laube, A Polish-American from Chicago, IL, he earned second prize at the 2022 Taylor Organ Competition and was a finalist in the 2024 Elizabeth Stephens **International Organ** Competition. Chlebek has performed

throughout the United States and Poland, and has participated in masterclasses with organists Janette Fishell, William Porter, and Arvid Gast. In 2022, he served as the first Sacred Music Intern at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C., where his playing was heard internationally via a livestream broadcast.

Adam is a graduate of the Oberlin Conservatory of Music, where he studied organ with Jonathan Moyer; there he also focused on choral singing and conducting. He sang in the Oberlin Musical Union, under the direction of Gregory Ristow, and Collegium Musicum, under the direction of Steven Plank; and has studied choral conducting with Jodi Kerchner and Ben Johns.

Adam is an avid jazz pianist; he has participated in Oberlin's Performance and Improvisation Ensemble, where he has performed with Jamey Haddad, Jay Ashby, and Becca Stevens. He is also the keyboardist for The Surrealists, a psych-rock band based in Evanston, IL.

Adam currently serves as the Director of Music at St. Thomas More Catholic Church in Rochester, New York, and sings in the acclaimed Christ Church Schola Cantorum, under the direction of Stephen Kennedy.



Andrew Van Varick. originally of Newton, New Jersey, is a doctoral student in organ performance and literature at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York, under the instruction of David Higgs. Previously, he received his Master's degree at Eastman, and he holds a Bachelor of Music degree from Montclair State University, where he studied organ with Vincent Carr and John Miller, piano with Mark Pakman, and harpsichord with Dr. Hsuan-Wen Chen.

Andrew has played in coachings and masterclasses with Raul Prieto Ramirez, Balint Karosi, Michel Bouvard, Wilma Jensen, Simon Johnson, Ezequiel Menendez, Chelsea Chen, and Alan Morrison. As a recitalist, he has performed on the "Young Organ Artist" series at the Central Synagogue in Manhattan, New York City, on the "Wednesdays at Noon" series at the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Newark, New Jersey, and for the Greensburg, Pennsylvania and Little Rock, Arkansas chapters of the AGO. In 2022, he was a semifinalist in the American Guild of Organists' National Young Artist Competition in Organ Performance, which was held at the AGO convention in Seattle. In September 2023, he was selected as a semifinalist in the Ninth International Organ Competition Musashino-Tokyo in Japan.

Currently, Andrew serves as the director of music and organist at the Central Presbyterian Church in Geneseo, New York.
