From the Pastor

Immanuel

Matthew quotes <u>Isaiah 7:14</u>: "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" (<u>Matt. 1:23</u>). The name Immanuel is pregnant with meaning. It literally means, "God with us"—-which may or may not be good news. For sinners under the judgment of God, "God with us" could be devastating (cf. <u>Isa. 8:9-10</u>). However, when God comes in mercy, his presence is the highest blessing. In the case of Jesus, the eternal Son came not to condemn the world but to save it (<u>John 3:16-17</u>). His impoverished, uncelebrated birth was part of the grand plan to save poor, lost sinners.

Yet Jesus did not save the world in his birth. It was in his life, death, and resurrection that he was declared the Son of God (Rom. 1:3-4). Indeed, he became a servant and offered himself as a ransom for many (Isa. 53; Matt. 20:28). Isaiah 57:15 tells us God dwells in a high and holy place, but also with the lowly and contrite. In the Incarnation, the exalted Son took the form of a lowly servant, and died the death of a criminal. Therefore, the Father exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name above every name (Phil. 2:5-11).

So as we read the birth stories, hang ornaments, and tell our children the mesmerizing account of baby Jesus, let us not forget that he's the eternal, omnipotent Son who upholds the universe and rules with a rod of iron. The magi recognized these truths; we must do the same. May we not fawn over him with mere sentimentality this Christmas, but bow low and adore him as our Savior and King.



Foodlink Distribution Goes Smoothly - God Does It Again With Clear Weather

Our final FoodLink distribution of the year was Thursday, November 17. If you recall, that was the day when the severe lake-effect snow was to begin here in WNY. There was some snow early in the day in Genesee County, but by the time our volunteers gathered in midafternoon, there was no snow, and the church parking lot was clear. The snow held off all afternoon until well after the food distribution was complete. Praise God!

Once again, demand for the food was high. We served more than 150 families representing more than 500 individuals. Special thanks to the numerous volunteers who came out on a cold day. Our neighbors in need really appreciate your loving support.

We are taking a winter break for the next three months. There will be no distribution hosted by us during December, January or February. Though dates are not confirmed, we expect to resume with a distribution in March 2023.

Christmas Eve Offering to Benefit Byron-Bergen Backpack Program

Each year the offering from our Christmas Eve service benefits a local charity. This year the Evangelism & Missions Committee has designated the funds from that service to go to the Byron-Bergen School Backpack Program.

The program provides a backpack of food for children in families who are among the neediest in our community. Often, there is no food in the house over the weekend. During the week, the kids rely on meals at school. Over the weekend, they often go hungry. The food in the backpack provided at the school on Friday each week, provides important nourishment over the weekend.

Volunteers who organize this program reported that more students than ever were recommended as needing the weekend food. Usually the number is lower in the fall, but this year the number is higher than the number of participants at the end of the school year.

Food is also more expensive. Volunteers say their funds on hand, all from donations, are in danger of running out. Our contribution from the Christmas Eve offering will make a difference to our hungry neighbors.

If you are led to make a donation, you can do so online, in the mail or in the offering boxes near the church entrances. Please note on the envelope you use or the check to designate your gift for the Christmas Eve offering so our treasurer will know to credit it appropriately.

Sewing With a Purpose

Sewing With A Purpose has collaborated with the veteran ministry to make knit hats for the veterans at Eagle Star Housing. A sample of the hats and the various stages of making a knit hat were on display at the Harvest Dinner in November.



Sewing With A Purpose has also been asked to create more of the protective eye coverings for the 1 -2 pound babies born in the NICU at Strong hospital.



With the recent lower monthly giving, we had concern last month that the needed use of the Accumulated Income Fund was going to threaten the positive balance we have usually had at the end of a year. However, October's very good giving of \$20,321 was the highest for the year and nearly \$3,000 above the monthly goal! Expenses were low, and thus we needed no funds at all from the AIF. In addition, \$900 was received for the Organ Fund.
