From the Pastor

Have you ever become incredibly disillusioned by someone or something? It may be someone, or a media figure you trusted, or a narrative you trusted, but then facts come out and what you were absolutely certain was the case, and to a certain extent even placed your faith in, only to find out later it wasn't true? We all have had moments like this.

For me, one of my biggest disillusions came after a famous apologist passed away. (I won't mention his name here.) He was an exceptional speaker as well as a writer in showing the differences from the Christian worldview to others. I was blessed by his book on courtship and was instrumental in my life in finding a Godly wife in Marty. He was a man who was able to combine the intellectual with the emotional part of Christianity which, if you know anything about me, you know that I greatly value.

Yet what he preached did not pierce his personal life, or at least much of it. After his death, accusations of sexual abuse that had dogged him in his later years were investigated more carefully and shockingly turned out to be true!

So what was I to make of this guy's ministry? What came immediately to mind was a quote that I remember from Alistair Begg, "The best of men are men at best." What we must remember is that everyone and everything in this world is subject to the effects of the fall. This means that everything we see and hear is corruptible and fallible, meaning that it is all subject to sin and error. This does not mean that everything we hear and see has sin and error, but simply we have to allow for the possibility.


One could see this played out in his ministry. In which his ministry was corrupted by terrible and tragic

sin, (many websites have scrubbed his sermons and personally I have a difficult time listening to them anymore, even though they contain wonderful nuggets of Biblical truth) and those around him were subject to terrible error as they did not hold him accountable.

So what are we to do? Not only with people, but also with the narratives that we hear from the news, social media, etc.? Is it all sinful and with error? In other words, should we wander around like agnostics thinking that nothing we encounter in this world is true, even from preachers? No, of course not. However, we must realize that all of it has the POSSIBILTY of sin and error.

Like everyone, I have my authors, speakers, sources of news, music, etc. that help shape my worldview. There's nothing wrong with that. In fact, I encourage that for others as well. However, within my mind and heart, I put those things in perspective and allow for the possibility that I might be wrong about not only what I come across, but the worldview that came from that.

However, I have also come to realize that there is one thing that I can see and hear that is infallible (without error) because it was made by someone that is infallible and incorruptible (without sin), and that is the Word of God. We will be talking about this on this first Sunday in May and we will discover what Isaiah 40:8 states: "The grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of our God endures forever."

Operation Christmas Child

Operation Christmas Child (OCC) is a global mission run by Samaritan's Purse, to tell children about Jesus through shoebox gifts. Our church participates in this mission by packing shoeboxes. Thank you for your donations thus far! We are looking forward to our church-wide packing party this fall.

In May, our shoebox collection theme is personal care items. This includes toothbrushes, toothbrush holders, dental floss, combs and hair brushes, washcloths and hand towels, nail clippers and nail files, band aids (non-medicated), lip balm (solid form, not liquid), stick deodorant, and washable/ reusable cloth menstrual pads. Water bottles or sturdy plastic cups are also a nice addition to the shoeboxes.

Samaritan's Purse does not allow toothpaste, liquids, lotions, vitamins, and medications in the shoeboxes. At present, bars of soap are allowed. This may or may not change due to international regulations. For now, we will collect bar soap that is in its original packaging with expiration dates that extend into mid 2023. If, at a later date, Samaritan's Purse decides not to accept bar soap, we will donate the soap to the North Bergen pantry.

Please continue to keep an eye out for stuffed animals for the shoeboxes. Perhaps there will be some for sale on after-Easter clearance. It would be lovely to be able to put a soft, cuddly friend into every shoebox we pack.

FoodLink Distribution Helps 138 Families

The April FoodLink distribution at our church helped 138 families. Those families included 101 senior citizens, 188 adults and 139 children -- more than 400 of our neighbors in need!

In addition, food was collected to share with shut-ins in our congregation, and the Methodist church's free community dinners. Five local food pantries received the bountiful leftovers at the end of our distribution time.

Many thanks to the 34 volunteers, which sounds like a big number, but everyone was needed. We have jobs appropriate for some of our junior members, like all the McNear boys, up to some of our most senior citizens.

We hope you will mark your calendar for our May distribution -- May 19. Plans remain the same. If you can volunteer, we appreciate you arriving by 2:45 pm. We unload the truck beginning at 3 pm and open the line for our clients by 4 pm. We are generally done by 6 pm.

If you forget how good God is, please note that on our April date, the weatherman was calling for rain. But we prayed that any rain would be over by 2 pm. We didn't have a drop of rain on our distribution. God is good!

May Mission of the Month: Open Door Mission

In 2022, Open Door Mission is celebrating 70 years of serving the Rochester community! Since 1952, they have provided for the emergency needs of the homeless and provided hope to those who need a new start. Their success in providing emergency care has been made possible through the dedicated support of faithful donors, which includes our church.

Their kitchen prepares nearly 100,000 meals each year. In 2021, they distributed over 315,000 pounds of food to those in need and collected nearly 300,000 pounds of clothing. Their programs provided over 13,000 nights of shelter to those in need. Their Samaritan House Crisis Center kept its doors open 24 hours a day from November to March to keep people safe from frigid temperatures.

We will receive an update during our worship service on May 15 when a representative of Open Door Mission visits us. The Mission has continued to expand and is completing renovation of a building to provide more long-term housing for the homeless in Rochester.

Their programs include:

- Emergency Housing & Meals
- Clothing and Food Distribution
- Addiction Recovery
- Special shelters during extreme cold and heat
- Coldwater Women's and Children's Home

All of their programs are based on the foundation of spreading the good news of salvation through Jesus's death on the cross and resurrection. As Anna Valeria-Iseman, the executive director, says, "It's a great day when a person who came to us beaten down by life is lifted up by our risen Lord."

Samaritan's Purse Sends Thanks for Gift to Support Efforts in Ukraine

Our church sent \$1,000 from our Tithe Fund to assist the work of Samaritan's Purse in the Ukraine. Here is their note of thanks:

Thank you for your gift to the ministry of Samaritan's Purse. Our teams are on the ground in Eastern Europe, caring for the suffering as war rages in Ukraine. Samaritan's Purse is meeting the emergency needs of refugees, working in Jesus' Name to care for women and children who have fled from the fighting. We set up our Emergency Field Hospital in Lviv, as well as other outpatient medical facilities in Ukraine, to care for patients who were unable to leave the country. We are working with a network of local churches to minister to hurting people.

Franklin Graham, director of Samaritan's Purse, recently returned from the hospital in Lviv, where they have 100 doctors, nurses and other medical personnel. The city suffered missile strikes while he was there. Many services are provided in the train station, which is a hub for refugees. As he said, "In everything we do, we proclaim the Gospel, obeying Jesus' command: You shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth (Acts 1:8)




Church Finances March 2022

"But who am I, and who are my people, that we should be able to give as generously as this? Everything comes from you, and we have given you only what comes from your hand. [....] Lord our God, all this abundance that we have provided for building you a temple for your Holy Name comes from your hand, and all of it belongs to you."

I Chron. 29:14,16

The giving for March was \$16,782 and about \$1,500 more than the giving from either January or February. However, the three-month total for this year is running \$2,500 behind the three-month giving for 2021. Each month's giving for this quarter is below the budget target of \$17,658. Expenses were greater for March, as they are for the last month of any quarter, and funds were needed from the Accumulated Income Fund. Nevertheless, the generous giving to the Organ Fund continued in March and another \$15,536 was given, giving a total of \$42,500 thus far received for our organ renovation.
