



The Kitchen - The Day Before

The good times continued into the afternoon and evening with the pig roast in the church parking lot. We had planned for 200-300 people for this time of good food and fellowship; however, we had over 600! Many if not most of the attendees were Bergen village folks who walked to the church. The Lord provided, for we had enough food, including the two roasted pigs, to feed the entire multitude. And, if we weren't already blessed enough, the weather absolutely perfect from dawn till dusk. It was a joy to behold the crowds in the

COMPLETION OF THE PROJECT: The days leading up to September 13 were full of activity with the rush to get as much done as possible and the church ready for the event. Saturday, the day before, was particularly full with several people devoting the full day and evening. The library (Virginia Rogers Memorial Library) received most of its book shelves and a nice reading chair and lamp, and the very attractive chandelier in the center

entranceway was hung. The basement and first floor restrooms received wallpaper trim and wall decorations. There was also considerable work accomplished in the kitchen with completion of installation of the gas stove, the sink, all the stainless steel countertops, and the fireproof serving window. (At several times during the day before the big event, the kitchen looked as though a bomb had gone off in it; however, many hours of work long into the night of September 12th were able to complete the job and leave the kitchen spotless.)



About all that of remains the renovation project is the installation of the hood for the kitchen stove and the folding wall in the large basement classroom. These items didn't arrive until early October, but both should be in by November 1st.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY: With nearly all of the bills in, we can state that the final cost will be about \$465,000. (To the total shown in the table below must be added the \$3500 for the stove hood, and \$6000 for the folding wall, and a few other items.)

Another \$40,000-50,000 of Fund Drive income has already been received and will be used to pay off a large part of the loan from the Bank of Castile. We hope to pay off most if not all of the loan by the end of this year with the sale of some of the assets in the Richards Endowment Fund.
